In 2017, in partnership with Develop, Reactiv8 secured funding through the CEC to provide a mentoring programme for schools to help students raise their aspirations, increase their motivation and develop their employability skills whilst at the same time empowering them to take control of their future.

The programme, which is called 'Jump Start' is delivered as 12 group sessions followed by 1:1 bespoke mentoring tailored to help identify progression routes and career pathways based on the foundation work carried out with the students in the group session. The impact on the students included: instil self-confidence, create a positive mind set, increase the student's self-worth, teach them how to set goals, build on them and achieve them by creating plans to enable them to do so.

To date we have worked with the following schools:

Bedford Academy, Mark Rutherford, Wootton, KCA, Putteridge High, Cardinal Newman, All Saints Academy and Hazeley Academy.

Some of the students said – "realised what I can achieve", "got along with my mentor", "it helped me know what I'd like to choose later in my life", "understand the skills I have", "I enjoyed the group sessions as I feel it has given me a different perspective on life" and "Go Ape was fun and challenged me". Students comments on the Jump Start Programme – interesting, motivating, know how to write a CV, enjoyable, relevant and taking part in a group.

In January 2018 we are looking forward to working with three new schools who will be starting our programme and they are Lord Grey, Lea Manor and Sir Herbert Leon.
